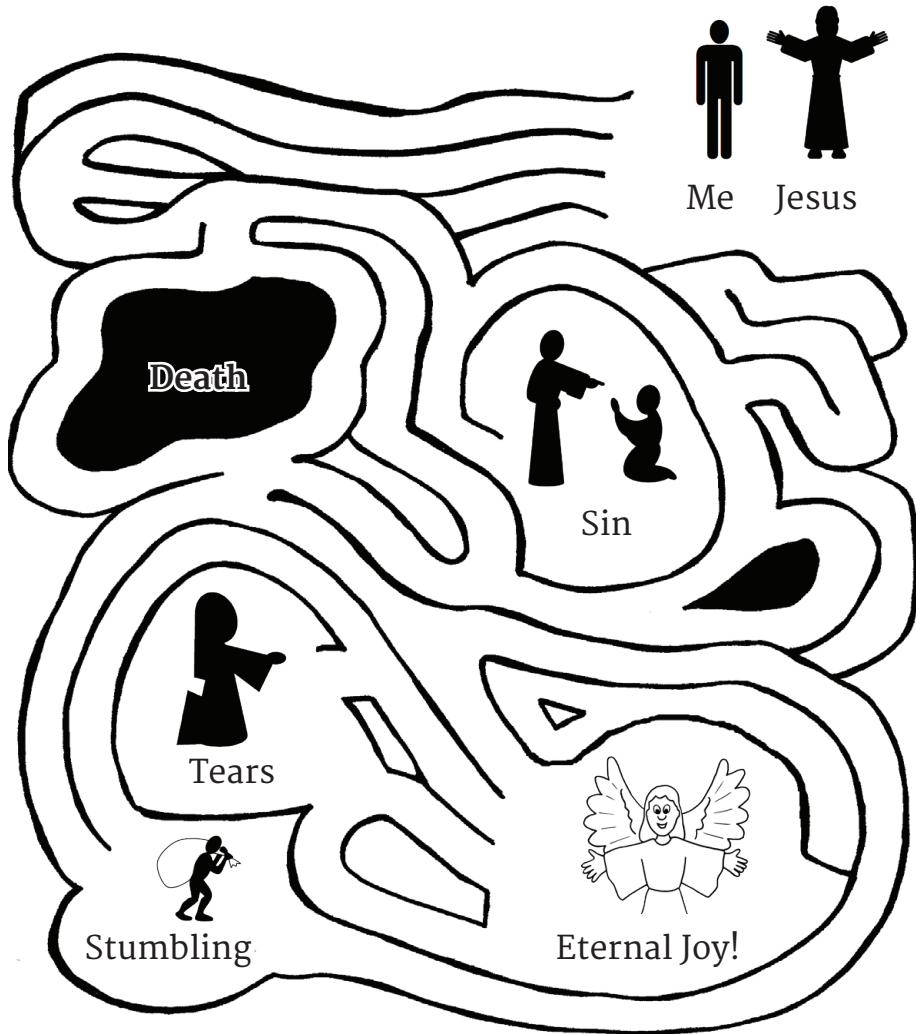


As the disciples walked along a road, Jesus joined them.
