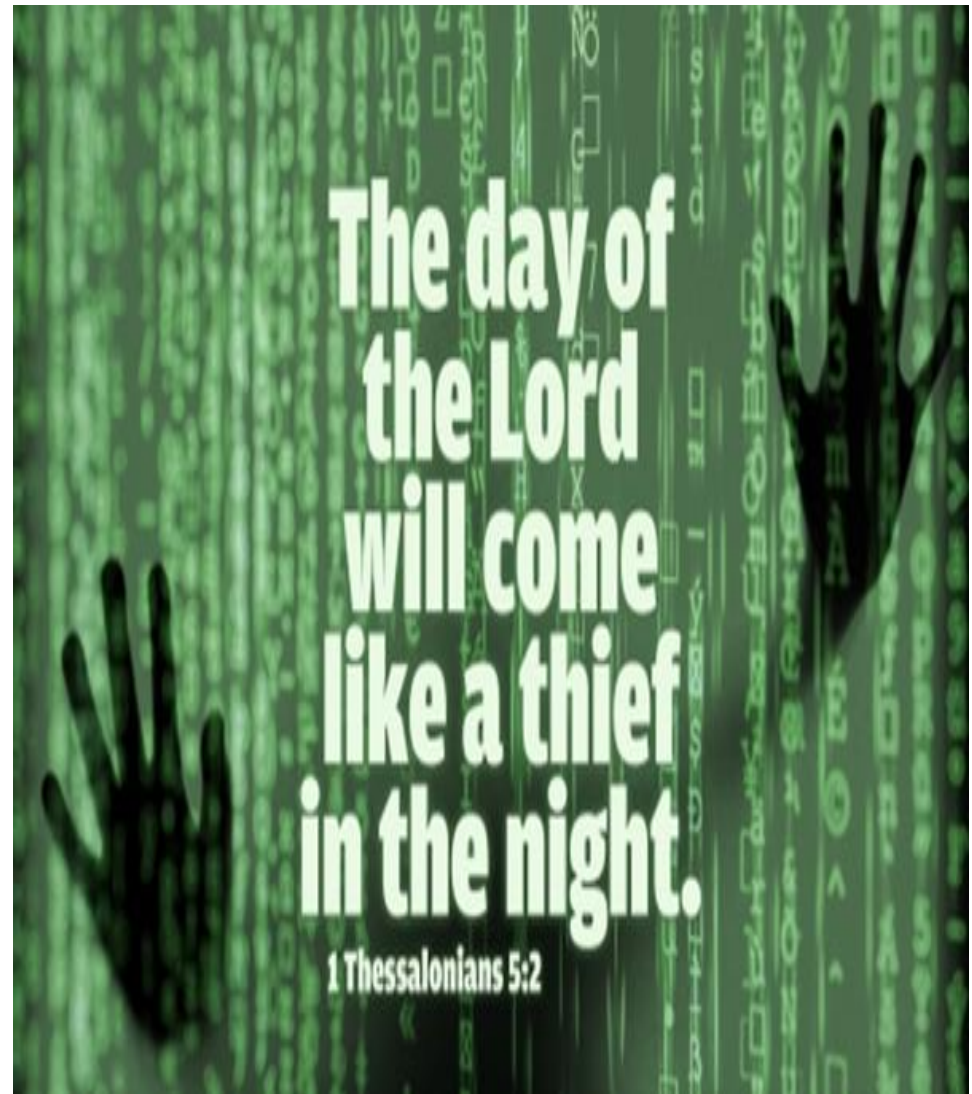
NO THANKSGIVING EVE SERVICE

TODAY'S READINGS: November is the end of the Church Year and the theme of this week's readings is Jesus' return in judgment. There are two responses to Christ's return: fear or welcome. Without faith and repentance, there is fear. The First Lesson confronts those complacent in their faith, "God's judgment is coming, and it will not be what you expect." The second response to Christ's return is preparedness. God's message to the faithful, "Be alert; don't be complacent. Remember you are dependent on my grace every moment." That's the message of the second lesson. The Gospel is Jesus' challenge to those who believe in him, to use our talents to serve him. Those who live in touch with Jesus in their daily lives will welcome his return with open arms.
