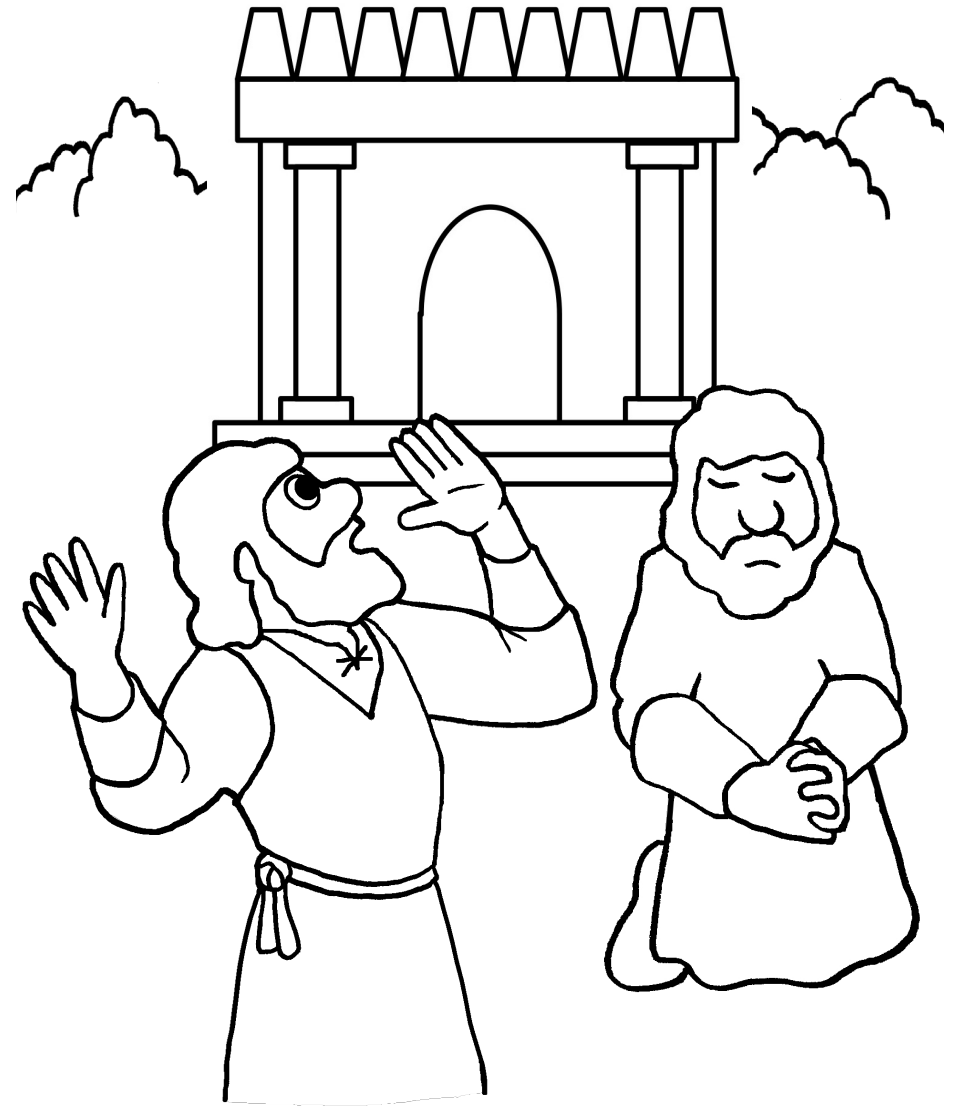
He also told this **parable** to some who **trusted** in themselves that they were **righteous**, and **treated** others with **contempt**: “Two men went up into the **temple** to **pray**, one a **Pharisee** and the other a **tax collector**. The Pharisee, standing by himself, **prayed** thus: ‘**God**, I **thank** you that I am not like other men, **extortioners**, **unjust**, **adulterers**, or even like this tax collector. I **fast** twice a week; I give **tithes** of all that I get.’ But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even **lift** up his eyes to **heaven**, but **beat** his **breast**, saying, ‘**God**, be **merciful** to me, a **sinner**!’ I tell you, this man went down to his house **justified**, rather than the other. For everyone who **exalts** himself will be **humbled**, but the one who **humbles himself** will be **exalted**.”
