Welcome! Tonight, we celebrate the Lord's Supper. All who believe that Christ is present in this Sacrament are invited to share in His supper. The inner glasses on the tray are grape juice or water, the rest, wine. Children who have not received Communion instruction should kneel at the altar with their arms crossed upon their chest to receive a Baptismal blessing.

The stripping of the altar at the conclusion of our Communion service is a liturgical practice used to show the connection between Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, between the institution of the Lord's Supper, and the death of our Lord on the cross. For it was "in the night in which He was betrayed" that our Lord Jesus Christ took bread and wine and instituted this means of grace, this Holy Sacrament.
